

### **Second Annual Visual Arts Contest**



This exciting competition is designed to encourage and celebrate youth visual art skills and gives the youth we serve another outlet for their creativity!

The topic for 2025 is "Bringing Out the Best". Artwork should reflect this topic. The contest will be held at the Club level and then at the International level.

The project for the Visual Arts Competition shall be the creation of 12 Optimist notecards with envelopes. The notecards will be for sale after June 30, 2025.

Artists must be age eleven or lower as of October 1, 2024.

There are two age divisions: up to 7 years of age and 8-11 years of age. Art for six of the note cards will be selected from each age division. The art for the cover will be selected from either age division.

Each local artist will receive a personalized participation certificate.

There will be a monetary award for 13 Optimist International winners, one for the image selected to go on the cover and one image selected for each of the 12 notecards. At the International level, **the 12 winners** will receive **\$150**; **the winner of the cover** will receive an additional **\$100**.

Deadline for submissions is February 14, 2025. Selection(s) locally will be made by February 25, 2025, and by Optimist international in late March, 2025.

This information, along with necessary submission forms, will be emailed to Bismarck-Mandan elementary school secretaries the first week in January and they will share with classroom teachers.
